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BEACHES Halkidiki can boast an amazing 550km of coastline, featuring a thousand different beaches, some rocky and imposing, others offering an endless expanse of golden sand. Some are busy and fashionable others no more than deserted coves among the rocks, but all reflect the deep green of the pine forest.

ACTIVITIES Halkidiki has developed a series of alternative tourism proposals for those who like outdoor activities. Besides water-skiing and sailing, jeeping, cycling, the region offers an unspoiled choice of water sports like scuba diving, snorkeling, canoe kayak. Of course a boat cruise or a sailboat is also available.

GASTRONOMY From the earth and sea comes a bounty of wonderful Mediterranean cuisine. The rich soil and mild climate of Halkidiki have made it famous for its olive oil, its fine dairy products, as well as traditional sweets and pastries made with natural ingredients such as pine nuts, dried fruit, honey and local jam.

ENTERTAINMENT Greece is famous for its 24-hour entertainment, its traditional kafeneion, cocktaills at the beach till the sun goes down, nightclubs, discos and bars and then a long evening staying to late in jazz or reggae...

ARISTOTLE The ancient city of Stagira where 2400 year ago, Aristotle, the visitor to nearby Mount Olympus, brought him along. He was the most important historian of Western Civilization, during his visit he came across the remains of a classical site in Halkidiki, known as the "School of Aristotle". As Aristotle died within a wide range of disciplines such as physics, biology, logic and did the foundations of what is now called philosophy. He also made a mark on the modern concept of science and on the modern culture of Halkidiki, as well as on the numerous traditions of the region.




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
